In Kansas 4-H we say one of our life skills is developing a concern for the community

One of the eight essential Elements of 4-H is the Opportunity to value and practice service to others.

- Youth need to feel their lives have meaning and purpose.
- By participating in 4-H community service and citizenship activities, youth connect to communities and learn to give back to others.

One of the "big four" (BMIGS) is Generosity – Community Service is a major contributor to meeting this.

In the book <u>The Good Teen</u>, based on the 4-H study, by Dr. Richard Lerner he talks about the Concern for Community and that 4-H develops that better than other youth development programs.

The Positive Youth Development C's, (five + one) Competence, Confidence, Connection, Character, Caring, plus Contribution. 4-H Community Service strengthening all six of the C's.

All of these point to the importance of service in our 4-H Clubs.
