Smallbore Rifle, Smallbore Pistol, Muzzleloading State Matches will be held on
September 27th

at the Capital City Gun Club, 12200 NW 4th St, Topeka, KS 66615.

Check-In & Equipment Check:

- Participants must check in on time.
- Check-In will begin at 8:00 AM & 12:30 PM
- Youth will confirm relay, pick up targets & proceed to equipment check-in on range.
- Firearms will be checked ON THE LINE beginning 30 minutes before relay starts.
- First relays begin shooting at 9:00 AM.
- Afternoon relays begin at 1:00 PM
- Concessions will be provided by RL/PT 4-H Club.
- An awards ceremony will be held at the conclusion of the match after final scores are tabulated.
- Teams will be determined by score. Only County or District Teams are allowed. If a youth from a separate county shoots with a different program, their score will count toward the County where they are enrolled, unless the program is considered a District program.
- **TEAM DESIGNATIONS** All match teams will be automatically selected based on top aggregate scores shot at the state match event. 1. For County Extension units, there may only be one team from each county unit. 2. For Extension Districts, there may be as many teams as there are counties in the district if the participants are registered as a district. The team may consist of Junior and Senior Members.
- Ear protection may be required for spectators, please come prepared.
- The deadline for submitting National Match applications for Archery, Muzzleloading, Shotgun, Small-Bore Pistol, and Small-Bore Rifle disciplines is October 19th.
